An articulated high school course is one in which a determination has been made that a course offered at the high school level is comparable to a specific community college course. High school students have the potential to earn college credits while still in high school.

No, typically the introductory level courses linked to college Career and Technical Education (CTE) certificates and degree programs are options for articulation, and vary by college. Gick on the college links for more information about articulation at each college site.

Any high school student that wants to earn college credit. Articulated courses are taught at a college level, and college level work and maturity are expected.
