Those who have eady transferred to the CSLC systems may under some circumstances return to Norco College to complete IGETC equirements A course can only be certified if it was approved for IGETC when it was taken.

Note: Riverside City College and Moreno Valley College are separate colleges and the sees that are approved for IGETCmay vary. Students who wish to take courses at another institution and apply them towards IGETOshould always first consult with a counselor to make sure the course will fulfill the intended requirement.

For the UC: Students who initially enroll at a UC campus, then leave and attend a California Community College, and subsequently return to the same UC campus, are considered "readmits" by the UC. Such students cannot use IGETC. However, students who enroll at a UC campus, then leave and attend a California Community College, and subsequently return to a different UC campus may use the IGETC pattern.
