

XI. College Reports

A. President of the Associated Students (Samia Irfan)

- Book Scholarship closed last weekend, 340 students ended up applying and 190 are eligible.
- Working on faculty parking being available to students after 5:30 district-wide.

B. College President (Monica Green)

- Enrollment is a particular concern:
 - 19/20 academic year we had 1,360 unduplicated students
 - 20/21 we went all online and had 708
 - Success rate continues to be successful at 82% success rate compared to 70% success rate for the average college student.
 - We have Upward Bound programs at CNUSD and Alvord and performing really well.
 - Norco College has a capture rate within CNUSD of 13.8 for first-time full-time students. Our capture rate needs to be improved.
 - Looking at participation more intentionally by ethnicity and gender.
 - Finding we are losing our males. Females outnumber males by almost two thirds.
- Encouraged everyone to visit the new Veterans Resource Center.

C. Vice President of Academic Affairs (Sam Lee)

- Had a meeting this morning about working with our regional high school districts to do automatic admissions and data sharing. Trying to auto admit our graduating seniors and later auto-enroll them based on the student's ed-plan.
- Tracking data through our new anthology system.

A. Academic Senate Standing Committees

Distance Education (Sarah Burnett)

- NOMIA is moving to Media Site Cloud. Faculty are no longer allowed to create videos with NOMIA, but they will have access to current videos in that site until June 20.
- There are two faculty members that have over 500 videos that need to be re-linked.
