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IX. ASNC Advisor Report

Discount cards

Edwin Romero: Discount cards will be provided for the students and they will receive an email that will have a link where they will be able to download the app and then have access to the discount card. There is also a pdf that you can download onto your phone instead of having to install the app. It is still possible to find more businesses to add to the discount card.

Fee waivers

Edwin Romero: Only 11 students waived their fees compared to last semester, which was 17 students that waived their fees. We are at 90% of enrollment

On Campus

Edwin Romero: Students are not allowed onto campus and are not able to staff booths on campus. Everyone that is on campus needs to be approved by the school president. Students are allowed to get approved to pick up specific items. They specifically did not approve anything that has to do with the Harvest festival. No booths are allowed. No curbside pickup to the public is allowed. We need to be more creative.
