Josh – We've allowed a lot of leniencies and we're looking for someone who wants to be a part of ASNC and those who are committed. This bill would be a great way to weed out those who are here based on friendships, we want to find those who are committed to serving the students at Norco College.

**Bryan motions to strike out attend and replace the wording with volunteer, Cheryl seconds.**

Emiliano – I disagree with the motion of volunteering because the original motion allows leniency. This can be a great way to introduce prospective students into the role of an ASNC member without them having to fully commit.

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Bryan – I agree with parts of Emiliano’s statement but at the same time, it makes the first option of “Attending an ASNC meeting” have way less of an impact than simply attending an event. If we really want to see if a candidate is dedicated to the organization, they should volunteer to show that they are fully committed to ASNC.

Carlos – I agree with Emiliano and Bryan’s statements and they both bring up valid arguments.

Josh – I kept the language vague so that prospecting members have wiggle room to show themselves and who they are and made it flexible for them to understand and participate in ASNC related activities.

Jacob – The language of “Attend a ASNC Senate meeting” or “Volunteer at an ASNC sponsored event.” should be made clear so we as the Senate and those in the future understand the steps needed to appoint prospective students.

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John – I have noticed ASNC as a whole are bringing in personal drama and making it everyone’s problem. It creates unnecessary issues and it’s important to separate the issues in the office from personal matters. I don’t think it’s smart to drag people in and create “sides”. Makes us look unprofessional to other organizations on campus.

Josh – We already look unprofessional to the campus. Amine has mentioned that Josh had asked multiple times to get off your phone. Remember our purpose as the ASNC, we handle thousands of dollars and the fact that we set an unprofessional tone makes our organization look like a joke.

Jacob – If all three times someone had to tell you to put your phone away, that in itself was a warning, even if not explicitly told so. So, you’re not disputing the fact that the phone is the problem.

Zayed – Since it wasn’t pointed out explicitly that using my phone was an issue, it would have been easier to correct my behavior. I didn’t want to look like I was leaving the meeting to attend a personal matter and making the meeting seem unimportant.

Dilraj – Being on your phone isn’t right, but we should also look at other possibilities as to why he was on his phone. You told everyone today that he was on his phone, but you [Josh] didn’t tell Zayed the first time he was caught that using his phone is an issue.

Josh - As a student government, what we say and what we vote on here will define us as an individual and as a body what our values are. Part of being attentive and doing your job is to be attentive and voice your option. If you stand with business and wanting things to be done... I have nothing against you, it just shows you’re unprofessional.

Anessa - When I spoke to Dr. Romero, he stated that Zayed had done a subpar job fulfilling his requisitions. It only looks like he is actually starting to do a good job during his requisitions once his position is threatened. I remember Zayed was a part of a group of people who wanted to put me and Anmol up for removal with no basis.

Josh – I understand that you can’t do everything right on your first couple of tries. Even so, requisitions is one thing, but what’s important is your character. I’ve never once heard you voice your opinion. I can’t justify you having a seat on this senate if you aren’t going to give respect to the body and voice your opinion. You have got absences on your record, your requisitions aren’t on spot, and your character shows you don’t care about the body and its objectives.

Desiree – Zayed has done the requisitions properly, but I have heard a lot of problems last semester about drama in the office.

Jacob – I agree with Jose that we are on the subject of neglect of duty, and I want to remind the senate that we are representing the students as senators. The fact that you have been told three times to get off your phone is already an issue in itself.

Jose – The first point I’d like to make is that while our votes define the decisions we make, it doesn’t define our character. Second, as far as your regular job duties are concerned, are you capable of continuing your job duties.

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Zayed – Yes

Jose – Would you say the action item being presented today acts as a wakeup call to grow?

Zayed – Yes

Jose – We are all learning; we all make mistakes. Nobody is perfect, who are we to take away Zayed's ability to grow?

Jacob – I pay my student fees and seeing how my student fees are handled, how can we justify this type of behavior not just to me, but the other students on campus?

Josh - I want Zayed to learn from his mistakes, but Zayed had been called multiple times by multiple members of the ASNC senate regarding his behavior. How many chances can we give before action is taken? You've been given so many opportunities to grow and it's only now that Zayed is being put up for removal that he has decided to make a change. Moving forward, regardless of the outcome of this item, what will show that Zayed won't cut corners?

Victor – I remember last semester we had a meeting and Dr. Romero had called out a group of people using their phones and Zayed was one of those people. During the retreat, we prioritized the importance of being professional.

Yusuf – There are many people inside the ASNC who act so unprofessional. I feel like moving on, if you want to set this precedent, you [Josh] need to follow through and take action for people in the senate using their phone.

Dr. Romero – It looks like you are talking to Josh rather than tackling the issue at hand.
